DIRECT ACCESS: Can You Do It?

Recently, it has come to the State Board's attention that there are questions surrounding whether or not physical therapy services can be conducted without a physician's order. Mississippi has direct access of a limited nature. The purpose of this article is to give physical therapists clarification as to what is and is not allowed based on the Mississippi Physical Therapy Practice Law §73-23-35(3). Reference for all queries is the Mississippi State Board of Physical Therapy Regulations Governing Licensure of Physical Therapists and Physical Therapist Assistants, particularly Part 3103, Chapter 3, Rule 3.1.

Queries:

- 1. Can a physical therapist evaluate a patient without a physician's order? Yes. A physical therapist may evaluate or provide wellness fitness without a physician's referral.
- 2. Who can refer patients to physical therapists? Physician, Dentist, Osteopath, Podiatrist, Chiropractor, Physician Assistant, or Nurse Practitioner.
- 3. Can a physical therapist perform physical therapy services without a prescription or a referral? Yes, under the following circumstances: a. Children with a diagnosed developmental disability pursuant to the plan of care. b. As part of a home health care agency pursuant to the plan of care. c. To a patient in a nursing home pursuant to the plan of care.

There are other circumstances under which physical therapy services without a prescription or a referral can be conducted.

- Related to conditioning or to providing education or activities in a wellness setting for the purpose of injury prevention, reduction of stress, or the promotion of fitness.
- 2. To an individual for a previously diagnosed condition for which physical therapy services are appropriate after informing the health care provider rendering the diagnosis. The diagnosis must have been made within the previous 180 days. The physical therapist shall provide the health care provider who rendered the diagnosis with a plan of care for physical therapy services within the first fifteen (15) days of physical therapy intervention.

Physical therapists in the State of Mississippi do have direct access to a certain extent to evaluate and treat patients without a referral or a physician's order.

Hopefully this information will be helpful to you in your practice. Refer to the Mississippi State Board of Physical Therapy Regulations Governing Licensure of Physical Therapists and Physical Therapist Assistants, particularly Part 3103, Chapter 3, Rule, 3.1 for further information.

POSITION STATEMENT

Physical Therapist Assistant Supervision for the MS State Board of Physical Therapy

The MS State Board of Physical Therapy is regularly and routinely asked to clarify supervisory standards of the physical therapist assistant by the physical therapist. This position statement interprets the requirements for supervision of the physical therapist assistant.

Scenario: Monday physical therapist visited nursing facility A where four (4) physical therapist assistants needed to be supervised on three new residents that the physical therapist had evaluated and placed on caseload. On Tuesday physical therapist evaluated four new home health patients and physical therapist was asked to supervise another physical therapist assistant to treat those patients. On Wednesday physical therapist goes to nursing facility B and is asked to supervise two more physical therapist assistants.

Query: Can the physical therapist supervise all of the physical therapist assistants in the above scenario?

Board Interpretation: This question, in various forms, has been posed to the Board. It is the opinion of the Board that under the MS Physical Therapy Law the supervising physical therapist of record may only supervise a total of four (4) physical therapist assistants. Physical therapist assistants may be at one or more facilities but the physical therapist of record may still only supervise a total of four physical therapist assistants. It is the responsibility of the physical therapist and the physical therapist assistant to document in the patient chart who the supervising physical therapist is for each date of service that care is rendered to the patient.

Reviewing the scenario above, the physical therapist would be supervising a total of eight physical therapist assistants in three different settings. This is prohibited by the MS Physical Therapy Law.

Query: What if one of the supervised physical therapist assistants becomes unavailable and a replacement physical therapist assistant takes over the case load, can the physical therapist be the supervising physical therapist for the replacement physical therapist assistant?

Board Interpretation: Yes. Under these circumstances the replacement physical therapist assistant must document in the patient chart who the supervising physical therapist is for each date of service that care is rendered to the patient. However, it is the responsibility of the physical therapist to ensure that he or she supervises no more than a total of four (4) physical therapist assistants and/or physical therapy students.

Good physical therapy requires good communication.

Revisions to the Dry Needling Requirements:

In its October 19, 2017 quarterly meeting, the Board voted on the documentation required for the approval of dry needling practice in Mississippi. If the physical therapist completed courses included on the Board's list of Approved Dry Needling Courses, the only requirement is the presentation of certificates of completion verifying a minimum of 50 hours of training.

If a physical therapist selects courses that do not appear on the list of Approved Dry Needling Courses, the therapist must provide the following course documentation to support completion of the requirements listed in the regulations in Part 3103, Rule 1.3 (c)D 1-2.

- 1. Complete the Therapist Prior Approval Dry Needling form for each course and include the \$50 fee
- 2. Description and overview of the course selected and completed by the physical therapist
- 3. Brochure or agenda that provides the number of hours of instruction/training
- 4. Educational course objectives
- 5. Resume or CV of instructor presenting the course
- 6. Certificate(s) of course completion

Please Note: All physical therapists must have received a letter of authorization from the Board prior to commencing the practice of dry needling for patient care.

Notification of Change of Employment Information

Part of the application process for a physical therapist or a physical therapist assistant in Mississippi is to **provide the name of your employer and the physical address where you will be practicing.** However, if you are uncertain of your employment at the time you make application, it is important that you remember to notify the Mississippi State Board of Physical Therapy (MSBPT) employment information (name of company, physical address, and phone number) as soon as possible after you become employed.

Notification of change of employment is also important. If you make a transition from one employer in Mississippi to another within the state, or even to an employer out-of-state, it is requested that you keep us informed of the physical location where you are practicing for as long as you are licensed in Mississippi.

Licensees in Mississippi who work for a parent corporation that is located in another state need to provide to MSBPT the name of their practice site and physical address with local phone number. An example is as follows:

Employer: South Therapy Corp. @ Highland Manor Nursing Home

Address: 1124 Riverside Drive

City: Jackson State: Mississippi Zip: 39202

Phone: (601) 555-5555

It is acceptable for you to provide the name of your parent corporation, but the practice site and the physical location in Mississippi are what the Board needs for the purposes of random audits and for third party notices for those of you who have not released your home address.

Notification of new employment or a change in employment may be made in one of the following ways:

- 1. Due to the online application and renewal process, many licensees are already familiar with how to access their profile online. You may go into your profile and add or make changes in your employment information and also change your mailing address if needed. The data system date stamps such changes so that we have a record of when you made the change. If you have not accessed your profile previously, please call the office at (601) 352-2918 for instructions and a temporary password.
- 2. Go to www.msbpt.ms.gov and select the **Forms** tab on the menu on the home page. Download the **Change of Name and Address** form, print it out, and complete the information in the employment section. Fax the form to (601) 352-2920.

Often a change of employment also means a change in residential (mailing) address. If that is the case, please update your mailing address at the same time, including email address and phone numbers.

We appreciate your help in keeping the database as up-to-date as possible.

Change of Home Address, Worksite or Name

It is the responsibility of licensees to provide the Board with written notification of address changes (home and/or work) no later than 30 days after such change is effective according to Part 3103 Rule 1.8. For a name change, a notarized copy of the legal document must accompany the request. Failure to keep your address or name change current will result in a \$25.00 fee for the cost of resending any correspondence or materials.
